THE MATCH-UP

The Chiefs return home after a two-game road trip as Kansas City faces Arizona at the New Arrowhead on Sunday (11/21). The Chiefs own a pristine 4-0 home record in 2010 and are 3-0 all-time against the Cardinals at Arrowhead in regular season play. Kansas City is coming off a 49-29 loss at Denver (11/14) and is seeking to snap a two-game losing streak and keep pace in the AFC West standings with Oakland (5-4) and San Diego (4-5). Arizona is seeking to halt a four-game losing skid after suffering a 36-18 loss vs. Seattle (11/14). The Cardinals are 1-4 on the road in 2010.

Head Coach Todd Haley arrived in Kansas City after a two-year stint as the Cardinals offensive coordinator (2007-08). Haley helped Arizona win its first division title since '75 as the Cardinals went on a remarkable postseason run to reach Super Bowl XLIII. Arizona waged a furious fourth-quarter comeback, scoring 16 unanswered points to gain a 23-20 advantage with 2:37 remaining in that title tilt before the Steelers took a 27-23 lead with 0:35 left to play. Haley has helped orchestrate a dramatic turnaround in Kansas City where the Chiefs are seeking to register their sixth victory this season after winning a combined six games in the two seasons prior to his arrival.

QB Matt Cassel set career highs for completions (33), attempts (53) and passing yards (469) at Denver (11/14), the second-highest single-game passing yardage performance in franchise history. Cassel tied a career high with four TDs, giving him 16 TDs and four INTs on the season, meaning only Patriots QB Tom Brady (17 TDs, 4 INTs) has a better TD/INT differential.

WR Dwayne Bowe has caught a TD in five straight contests, tying E Chris Burford (9/8/62-10/12/62) and WR Otis Taylor (10/23/66-11/20/66) for the longest streak in franchise history. Bowe set career highs with 13 catches for 186 yards with two TDs last week, the second-highest single-game reception tally in KC history. Bowe has 30 catches for 454 yards with eight TDs over the last five games. He is tied for the NFL lead with nine TD catches and is on pace to finish the year with 16 TDs, which would break Burford's team record of 12 set in '62.

The Chiefs have outscored their opponents 26.8 to 13.5 ppg margin in their first four home contests and have held all four of those foes to 20 points or less. The Chiefs are 22-9 (.710) against NFC opponents at Arrowhead dating back to '95 and are seeking their first sweep of NFC foes at home since 2006. Next week Kansas City is at Seattle (11/28), while Arizona hosts San Francisco (11/29).

THE SERIES

The Chiefs are 7-2-1 (.750) against Arizona in the 10 previous regular season meetings between the two clubs. The Chiefs have won four of the last five contests between the two franchises. Kansas City has claimed wins in all three regular season contests at Arrowhead, including a 49-0 victory (12/1/02), the largest shutout win in Chiefs history. RB Priest Holmes posted 113 rushing yards and two TDs in that game, while WR Dante Hall had a 90-yard punt return TD.

The Chiefs registered a 23-20 victory at Arizona (10/8/06) in the Chiefs only appearance at University of Phoenix Stadium as K Lawrence Tynes connected on a 19-yard game-winning FG. Kansas City posted a 1-1 mark in regular season action at Sun Devil Stadium with the Cardinals claiming a 24-16 victory in the final meeting between these two clubs at that facility (10/21/01). Kansas City's lone win at Sun Devil Stadium featured a 76-yard TD jaunt by QB Steve Bono. The initial regular season contest between the two clubs came in '70 when the teams dueled to a 6-6 draw at Municipal Stadium (11/22/70).

The most recent preseason clash between the two franchises resulted in a 27-17 Cardinals win at Arrowhead (8/18/08) when current Chiefs Head Coach Todd Haley served as Arizona's offensive coordinator.

The Chiefs and Cardinals dueled in the preseason for 21 straight seasons from '68 to '88 when the two clubs were both stationed in Missouri. The first NFL contest held at Arrowhead was a Governor's Cup preseason match-up vs. the St. Louis Cardinals (8/12/72). RB Ed Podolak, the '88 inductee into the Chiefs Hall of Fame, dove over the goal line for a one-yard TD with 4:51 elapsed in the second quarter of that game to mark the first-ever score at Arrowhead. Podolak's plunge sparked a 24-point second quarter which also included a 75-yard punt return by DB Larry Marshall and a 28-yard INT return by CB Jim Marsalis. Those three TDs along with a 31-yard FG by Pro Football Hall of Fame K Jan Stenerud paved the way for a 24-14 win in the initial game ever played at Arrowhead.

CHIEFS HEAD COACH - TODD HALEY



Todd Haley was named the 11th head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs on February 6, 2009 and is in his second year leading the Chiefs. Haley is in his 16th season in the NFL in 2010 and his 14th season as an NFL coach after beginning his career as a scouting assistant with the N.Y. Jets in '95.

Haley joined the Chiefs after a two-year stint as Arizona's offensive coordinator (2007-08), helping the Cardinals reach Super Bowl XLIII as the club won its first division title since '75. Under Haley's direction, the Cardinals ranked third in the league in scoring as Arizona registered a franchise-record 427 points in 2008. The Cardinals also threw a team-record 32 TD passes in 2007.

Haley has won division titles with four different NFL teams. He served as passing game coordinator/WRs coach under Bill Parcells with Dallas (2004-06) after beginning his career under Parcells with the N.Y. Jets ('97-00). He also served as WRs coach with Chicago (2001-03). Born on February 28, 1967, Haley grew up in Upper St. Clair, PA. He is the son of longtime NFL personnel executive Dick Haley, who helped build the Steelers Super Bowl teams of the '70s. A '91 graduate of the University of North Florida, he was a recipient of that school's 2009 Distinguished Alumni Award.

THE CLASS OF 2010

Members of Kansas City's 2010 draft class have made substantial contributions to the Chiefs. S Eric Berry currently has 71 tackles to rank as the second-leading tackler on the team. He had 2.0 sacks at Oakland (11/7). WR Dexter McCluster and TE Tony Moeaki have both earned NFL Rookie of the Week honors this season. CB Javier Arenas and S Kendrick Lewis have also played a key role on defense and special teams, while G/C Jon Asamoah started his first career NFL game at right guard vs. Buffalo (10/31) in place of an injured G Ryan Lilja and saw extensive action at left guard at Denver (11/14) in place of an injured G Brian Waters. Six of KC's draft picks are on the Chiefs 53-man roster and served as team captains at their respective colleges last season.

TURNOVER POINT DIFFERENTIAL

Kansas City ranks second in the NFL with a +51 turnover point differential (58 scored/7 allowed), trailing only Green Bay (+62). The Chiefs were the final team in the league to allow any points off giveaways in 2010. The teams with the league's five best turnover point differentials own a combined 29-16 (.644) record.

CARDINALS HEAD COACH - KEN WHISENHUNT



Ken Whisenhunt was named the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals on January 14, 2007. Whisenhunt is the first head coach in franchise history with a .500 record or better in each of his first three seasons.

Whisenhunt led the Cardinals to NFC West titles in 2008 and 2009, the team's first back-to-back division crowns since '74-75. The 2008 season saw the franchise's first postseason appearance since '98, first division crown since '75 and first home playoff game since '47. The Cardinals also won the NFC Championship Game and advanced to Super Bowl XLIII for the first time in team history.

Before joining Arizona, Whisenhunt spent six seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers (2001-06), earning a Super Bowl XL ring as the Steelers offensive coordinator. He also had coaching stops at the N.Y. Jets (2000), Cleveland ('99) and Baltimore ('97-98). He began his coaching career as an assistant at Vanderbilt ('95-96).

Whisenhunt was a 12th-round pick (313th overall) of Atlanta in the '85 NFL Draft, spending nine seasons in the NFL with the N.Y. Jets ('91-93), Washington ('89-90) and Atlanta ('85-88). In 74 career NFL games (37 starts), the Georgia Tech product caught 62 passes for 601 yards with six TDs. Whisenhunt was born February 28, 1962 in Atlanta, GA.

KC'S RUSHING RAMPAGE

The Chiefs currently lead the NFL in rushing (165.3 ypg) and are third in the NFL in rushing differential, averaging 60.9 more rushing ypg than their opponents thanks in large part to the duos of RBs Jamaal Charles and Thomas Jones. At their current pace, Charles (projected 1,351 yards) and Jones (projected 1,018 yards) would become the seventh duo in NFL history to register a 1,000-yard campaign for the same team in a season.

2010 KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

QB Matt Cassel has completed 99 of 164 passes (60.4%) for 1,168 yards with 11 TDs and two INTs in his last six starts, good for a 99.3 rating. RB Jamaal Charles has a team-high 760 rushing yards. RB Thomas Jones has 573 rushing



yards and is the first player in NFL history with a 500-yard rushing season with five different teams. WR Dwayne Bowe (D1-07) can become the first player in franchise history with a TD catch in six straight games. He leads the team in receptions (39), rec. yards (606) and TD catches (9). Rookie TE Tony Moeaki (D3b-10) has 31 receptions for 378

yards with two TDs. Four-time Pro Bowl G Brian Waters is in his 11th season in Kansas City. C Casey Wiegmann and G Ryan Lilja were both acquired in the off-season and are joined by T Brandon Albert (D1b-08). T Barry Richardson (D6b-08) has opened nine straight games.

LB Mike Vrabel caught his 10th career TD pass at Houston (10/17). LB Tamba Hall tied a career high with 3.0 sacks vs. SF (9/26) and earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors. He is tied for fourth in the NFL with 8.0 sacks and needs one more to break his career high of 8.5. LB Derrick Johnson registered his third career INT return TD vs. Jacksonville (10/24). LB Jovan Belcher starts at ILB. DE Glenn Dorsey (D1a-08) and DT Ron Edwards work on the defensive front with DT Shaun Smith, who has opened four games. CB Brandon Flowers (D2-08) led the team with five INTs last year and owns two INTs in 2010. He pairs with CB Brandon Carr (D5-08). Rookie S Eric Berry (D1-10) has two INTs and had 2.0 sacks at Oakland (11/7). S Jon McGraw has two INTs, including one at Oakland (11/7). Rookie S Kendrick Lewis (D5a-10) has started five games.

K Ryan Succop (D7c-09) has hit 25 of his last 29 FG attempts. P Dustin Colquitt set a career record with a 52.0-yard net punting avg. vs. IND (10/10). WR Dexter McCluster (D2a-10) has a 20.9-yard punt return avg. He had a franchise-long 94-yard punt return TD vs. San Diego (9/13). CB Javier Arenas owns a 21.2-yard kickoff return average.

2010 ARIZONA CARDINALS

Former Pro Bowl QB Derek Anderson joined the Cardinals in the off-season and owns an 18-22 (.450) record as a starter. He has completed 121 of 226 passes for 1,481 yards with six TDs and eight INTs. Rookie QB Max Hall has

also started three games. RB Tim Hightower (D5-08) has carried the ball 79 times for 376 yards with three TDs, including a team-long 80-yard TD run at Atlanta (9/19). RB Beanie Wells (D1-09) also has two rushing TDs for Arizona. Four-time Pro Bowl WR Larry Fitzgerald (D1-04) has 49 receptions for 601 yards and four TDs. WR Steve Breaston (D5-07) is averaging 15.7 yards per catch with 29 catches for 456 yards. T Levi Brown (D1-07) pairs with T Brandon Keith (D7-08). On the interior, 13-year veteran G Alan Faneca joined the Cardinals in the off-season and has made nine straight Pro Bowls for the AFC squad. Faneca works with G Deuce Lutui (D2-06) and C Lyle Sendlein.



Two-time Pro Bowl DT Darnell Dockett (D3-04) and DE Calais Campbell (D2-08) each registered 7.0 sacks in 2009 to lead the Cardinals defense. Campbell has 3.0 sacks in 2010. NT Bryan Robinson works in the middle. Four-time AFC Pro Bowl LB Joey Porter joined the Cardinals as a free agent in the off-season and has 5.0 sacks. LB Paris Lenon signed as an unrestricted free agent in the off-season. LBs Clark Haggans and Daryl Washington (D2-10) round out the linebacking corps. Pro Bowl CB Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie (D1-08) has 12 career interceptions, including two in 2010. He is paired with CB Greg Toler (D4-09). S Kerry Rhodes was acquired in an off-season trade with the N.Y. Jets and has two INTs in 2010. Tenth-year S Adrian Wilson has made three Pro Bowls and rounds out the Cardinals secondary.

K Jay Feely joined Arizona's roster as a free agent in the off-season and has converted 240 of 293 FGs and 340 PATs for 1,060 career points. P Ben Graham has a 43.0-yard gross punting average. RB LaRod Stephens-Howling (D7a-09) handles kick returns while WR Andre Roberts (D3-10) returns punts.

The Chiefs FOX Football Radio Network, anchored by KCFX-FM (101.1) in Kansas City, carries all Chiefs games. Eight-time Kansas Broadcaster of the Year, Mitch Holthus, is in his 17th year handling the play-by-play duties, while Hall of Fame QB Len Dawson adds color commentary with sideline reports from former Chiefs Pro Bowl long snapper Kendall Gammon. The KCFX pregame show begins at 9:00 AM (CT). Following the game, the Chiefs FOX Football Radio Network, anchored by 101 the Fox (KCFX-FM), will air the first hour of the postgame show. The second hour will air on Sports Radio 810 (WHB-AM).

CHIEFS VS. CARDINALS AT ARROWHEAD

Kansas City is seeking to make the Cardinals the first franchise the club has posted a perfect 4-0 record against at Arrowhead in regular season play. The Chiefs are also 3-0 at Arrowhead vs. Atlanta and Washington. The Chiefs have outscored the Cardinals by an average of 40.3 to 12.7 ppg in those games, scoring 34 or more points in all three of those contests, including a 49-0 win (12/1/02). KC has tallied 150.0 rushing ypg in those games, while allowing 91.0 rushing ypg and forcing 15 turnovers.

CHIEFS-CARDINALS RUSHING REPORT

The Chiefs are averaging an NFL-high 165.3 rushing ypg and are fourth in the NFL with a 4.77 yards per carry average. KC has compiled 200+ team rushing yards in four games and is looking to accomplish the feat in five games for the first time since setting a team record with eight such games in '78. Arizona ranks 29th in the NFL, averaging 82.7 rushing ypg and is 28th in rushing defense, allowing 132.4 ypg. Arizona has allowed 142.0 rushing ypg in its five road games in 2010 to rank 29th in the league. The Cardinals are 9-19 (.321) when allowing a 100-yard rusher since 2007. Arizona is 8-1 (.889) when producing a 100-yard rusher under Ken Whisenhunt.

KC is second in the league with 39 runs of 10 or more yards in 2010, including 25 from RB Jamaal Charles, who is tied for second in that category. Meanwhile Arizona ranks 28th in the NFL with 21 carries of 10+ yards in 2010. The Chiefs are tied for eighth in the NFL, allowing only 21 runs of 10+ yards. Arizona has allowed 37 carries of 10+ yards. Only Tampa Bay (42), Buffalo (41) and Carolina (40) have permitted more. Kansas City, Minnesota and Tennessee are the only clubs that haven't allowed a rushing TD at home.

CHIEFS-CARDINALS SCORING STATS

The Chiefs have held six of their nine opponents to 20 points or less in 2010, posting a 5-1 record in those contests. Arizona is tied for 23rd in the NFL, scoring 19.4 ppg and is 32nd in scoring defense, allowing 29.0 ppg. The Cardinals have been outscored by an 86-point margin (261-175) in 2010. Only Carolina at -111 (215-104) has a bigger scoring deficit in 2010. The Chiefs have scored their most points (75) in the second quarter and are fourth in the NFL with a +24 scoring differential in that quarter. Only Indianapolis (+55), Atlanta (+52) and Pittsburgh (+31) are better. The Cardinals have allowed a league-high 102 points in the second period and have been outscored by a 37-point margin (102-65) in that quarter. Only Houston (-42) has a bigger deficit. The Cardinals and Jaguars have allowed a league-high 27 points on their opening possession of games in 2010.

THE ARROWHEAD ADVANTAGE

The Chiefs are seeking to go 5-0 at home for the first time since posting an 8-0 mark in 2003. Atlanta, Baltimore, Indianapolis and New England are the only other undefeated teams at home in 2010. All five teams currently lead or are tied for their division lead, owning a 31-14 combined record.

KC ranks third in the league allowing 13.5 ppg at home in 2010. The Chiefs have held all four of their home opponents to 20 points or less, joining only Cleveland, Indianapolis, N.Y. Jets, Pittsburgh and St. Louis to accomplish that feat in 2010. The Chiefs are 4-2 under Todd Haley when holding their opponents to 20 points or less at Arrowhead. The Cardinals are 1-12 (.077) when being held to 20 points or less under Ken Whisenhunt, including a 1-4 mark in 2010. Arizona is averaging 13.6 ppg on the road in 2010, the second-lowest mark in the NFL.

KC is scoring 26.8 ppg at home, tying Arizona for the eighth-best mark in the NFL. The Chiefs have scored 20+ points in three of their four home contests. Arizona is allowing 28.8 ppg in its five road contests in 2010, ranking 30th in the NFL. No team has allowed more total points on the road than Arizona (144).

CHIEFS-CARDINALS TURNOVER STATS

KC has committed a league-low seven turnovers in 2010 and is tied for eighth in the NFL with a +5 (12 takes/7 gives) turnover margin. The club is on pace for 12.4 gives in 2010. KC set the NFL single-season record with 12 gives in '82. The Chiefs have lost an NFL-low three fumbles this season. KC had been even or positive in nine straight games prior to going -1 at Denver (11/14).

Arizona and Carolina are tied with an NFL-high 26 giveaways. The Cardinals and Chargers have each lost a league-high 13 fumbles. The Cardinals and Raiders are tied for the NFL lead with 22 total fumbles.

The Chiefs are second in the NFL with a +51 turnover point differential (58 scored/7 allowed). Arizona is 28th in the NFL with a -28 turnover point differential (52 scored/80 allowed). No team has permitted more points off giveaways than Arizona (80). Exactly 30.7% (80 of 261) of the points the Cardinals have allowed have come off giveaways. The Cardinals have compiled a 19-3 (.864) record when positive in the turnover column under Ken Whisenhunt, but are 3-23 (.115) when negative, including a 1-13 (.071) mark on the road. Arizona is 7-2 when owning a positive turnover margin on the road dating back to 2007.

CHIEFS PASSING STATS

Chiefs QB Matt Cassel leads the NFL with a 6.00 TD percentage (min. 200 atts.), while only Patriots QB Tom Brady (+13) has a better TD/INT differential than Cassel (+12). Cassel is sixth in the NFL with a 1.5 INT percentage. Cassel owns a 4-0 record at Arrowhead in 2010, completing 53 of 93 passes (57.0%) for 663 yards with seven TDs and one INT, good for a 99.9 rating. Over the last seven games, Cassel has completed 132 of 217 passes (60.8%) for 1,637 yards with 15 TDs and two INTs, numbers that equate to a 103.4 rating. BIG PLAYS, NEGATIVE PLAYS

The Chiefs have committed 42 negative offensive plays, the third-lowest tally in the league behind the N.Y. Jets (37) and Miami (41). Kansas City is tied for ninth in the league with 122 plays of 10+ yards, while Arizona is tied for 29th with 95 plays 10+ yards. Only Carolina (86) and Seattle (90) have produced fewer. The Cardinals have a league-low four TDs of 10+ yards, including a league-low two passing TDs. The Chiefs have only allowed 109 plays of 10+ yards, tying for 12th in the NFL. Arizona has permitted a league-high 141 plays of 10+ yards, including 10 TD passes of 10+ yards. No team has allowed more plays of 20+ yards than the Cardinals (50), who have relinquished a league-high 40 passes of 20+ yards. Only Chicago (11) and Cincinnati (11) have given up more rushes of 20 or more yards than Arizona (10).

WRS FLOURISH UNDER HALEY

During Todd Haley's tenure as an NFL coach, a number of WRs have flourished under his tutelage, including Keyshawn Johnson, Marty Booker, Terry Glenn, Terrell Owens and Anquan Boldin. Arizona WR Larry Fitzgerald produced a pair of Pro Bowl seasons during Haley's tenure as the offensive coordinator with the Cardinals from 2007-08, catching 196 passes for 2,840 yards with 22 TDs over that two-year span. He set NFL postseason records with 30 receptions, 546 receiving yards and seven TDs in 2008. Over that two-year period, Boldin registered 160 receptions for 1,891 yards with 20 TDs.

Chiefs WR Dwayne Bowe has caught 30 passes for 454 yards with eight TDs during his last five games. He has caught a TD pass in five consecutive games, tying E Chris Burford and WR Otis Taylor for the longest streak in Chiefs history. Bowe has a career-high nine TD catches and is seeking to surpass the single-season club record of 12 TDs set by Burford in '62. At his current pace, would finish the year with a career-high 1,077 receiving yards.

THOMAS JONES NOTES, OTHER TIDBITS

Chiefs RB Thomas Jones is the only RB running back in NFL history to record a 500-yard rushing season with five different teams, doing it with Arizona (2002), Tampa Bay (2003), Chicago (2004-06), the N.Y. Jets (2007-09) and Kansas City (2010). Jones needs 210 more yards to become the 25th player in league history with 10,000 career rushing yards.

The Chiefs offense leads the NFL, averaging 7.29 yards to go on second down. KC is averaging 52.2 total rushes and completions per game to rank fifth in the NFL, while Arizona (37.3 per game) ranks 32nd. KC (30:28) ranks 16th in time of possession, while Arizona (25:47) is 32nd. KC (26.6-yard line) is second in the NFL in opponent average starting position behind Atlanta (25.9). Arizona has scored a league-high eight return TDs (4 opp. fumble returns, 2 kickoff returns, 1 INT return and one own fumble return). Only Carolina (102) has scored fewer offensive points than Arizona (119).

Faced with a 14-0 deficit on the road, the Chiefs clawed their way back to pull out a 23-20 comeback victory at Arizona. Tied 20-20 with under 3:00 remaining, a 78-yard screen pass from QB Damon Huard to RB Larry Johnson set up K Lawrence Tynes for the game-winning field goal.

Making his first NFL start, Cardinals rookie QB Matt Leinart led off the game with a 49-yard TD pass to WR Anquan Boldin. Moments later the Chiefs fumbled a handoff exchange and set the Cardinals up for another TD as Leinart threw a five-yard TD pass to WR Larry Fitzgerald on third-and-goal. Before the Chiefs could blink, they found themselves in a 14-0 hole.

Kansas City regrouped early in the second quarter as Huard completed first-down passes to WR Dante Hall and TE Kris Wilson before Tynes booted a 45-yard field goal to start cutting into Arizona's lead at 14-3.

The Chiefs defense and special teams began turning up the intensity, as well. Back-to-back sacks by DE Jared Allen and DT Ron Edwards forced a Cardinals punt from their own 22-yard line. Rookie S Bernard Pollard then blocked the P Scott Player punt, giving the Chiefs the ball at the Arizona six-yard line.

From there, Huard dumped a third-and-goal pass to Johnson and watched him shed a pair of tacklers before diving across the goal line, pulling the Chiefs within 14-10. Arizona went three-and-out on its next possession, but another Chiefs fumble led to a 41-yard Cardinals field goal and a 17-10 halftime score.

Arizona would add another 45-yard field goal before the Chiefs would rev up their offense again. Trailing 20-10 at the start of the fourth quarter, Kansas City put together a seven-play, 66-yard scoring drive that concluded when Huard hit Parker in the corner of the end zone for what appeared to be a TD. The officials on the field ruled that it was incomplete, but the Chiefs challenged and the call was changed to a TD. Huard's second TD pass of the day pulled KC within three points at 20-17 midway through the fourth quarter.

Moments later CB Ty Law picked off Leinart at the Arizona 22-yard line. Tynes converted the turnover into three points, knotting the score at 20-20 with 5:03 left.

A defensive stop put the ball in the Chiefs hands at their own 13-yard line with the game on the line. On the first play from scrimmage, Johnson took a short screen pass and turned it upfield for a 78-yard gain. At the end of the play, Johnson was injured on a vicious facemask penalty, forcing backup RB Dee Brown to try for the score. Brown was stuffed on three straight runs up the middle and the game was saved for the Chiefs when TE Jason Dunn recovered a Brown fumble on third down. Tynes made sure Dunn's effort didn't go for naught by knocking through the go-ahead 19-yard field goal.

With no timeouts and 1:31 remaining in the game Leinart moved Arizona to the Chiefs 33-yard line. From there, 2005 Pro Bowl K Neil Rackers missed wide right on a would-be game-tying field goal attempt, preserving Kansas City's 23-20 road win.

The Chiefs lost by a 49-29 margin to the Denver Broncos at INVESCO Field at Mile High. Despite falling behind 35-0 in the contest, the Chiefs battled back to register 484 yards of total offense. QB Matt Cassel registered a career-high 469 passing yards. WR Dwayne Bowe finished the game with a career-high 13 catches for 186 yards and two TDs.

Denver won the toss and on the Broncos fourth play from scrimmage QB Kyle Orton hit WR Brandon Lloyd between two Chiefs defenders for a 37-yard pickup to KC's 31. On second and 10 from the Chiefs 17-yard line Orton hit RB Knowshon Moreno out of the backfield who scampered into the end zone, giving Denver an early 7-0 lead. The Broncos added 14 more points before the end of the first quarter with two TD passes by Orton. The first went to WR Brandon Lloyd on a quick slant and the second a 40-yard pass to an outstretched Gaffney for a TD. The Chiefs elected to review the play, but the instant replay system was inoperable so the ruling on the field of a TD stood, giving the Broncos a 21-0 lead.

The Chiefs offense got into a groove, but a sack by LB Mario Haggan forced KC to attempt a 52-yard FG from K Ryan Succop that sailed wide right. Eight plays later QB Tim Tebow bootlegged into the end zone from one-yard out advancing Denver's lead to 28-0.

KC's offense drove to Denver's eight-yard line on its ensuing possession before Cassel was sacked by Haggan and stripped of the football. LB Jason Hunter recovered the ball and took it 75 yards for a TD, moving Denver's lead to 35-0.

Kansas City's offense put together a late scoring drive near the end of the half set up by a 38-yard pass to WR Verran Tucker. Two plays later Cassel connected with RB Jamaal Charles for a five-yard TD, cutting Denver's lead to 35-7. The Broncos received the ball with 1:22 to play before intermission. The Broncos attempted a 58-yard FG with 0:18 to play but K Matt Prater's attempt fell short and S Eric Berry returned it 87 yards to Denver's 22-yard line. Succop put through a 40-yard FG to cut Denver's lead to 35-10 at intermission.

Kansas City had possession to open the second half, but was forced to punt. The Broncos then orchestrated a 10-play, 60-yard drive culminating with a Tebow three-yard TD pass to FB Spencer Larsen, upping Denver's advantage to 42-10.

The Chiefs put together a quick scoring drive capped when Cassel hit Bowe for a 15-yard TD pass, putting the score at 42-17. The Broncos answered right back with a TD of their own when Orton connected with Lloyd in the corner of the end zone from 15 yards out, but it was ruled incomplete. A review showed Lloyd got both feet down giving the Broncos a 49-17 lead with 11:55 remaining.

Faced with fourth and goal from the 11-yard line Cassel hit WR Chris Chambers on a post route but failed to convert a two-point attempt making the score 49-23 Denver. The Chiefs attempted an onside kick but the Broncos recovered.

The ball exchanged hands as the clock winded down. Cassel found Bowe for his second TD catch of the game from 22 yards out with 0:15 to play. The two-point conversion failed leaving the final score at 49-29.
