THE MATCH-UP

The Chiefs will celebrate the grand opening of the New Arrowhead in fitting fashion with a Monday Night Football clash against the San Diego Chargers (9/13) to close out a MNF doubleheader on ESPN. Monday's game will culminate a \$375 million renovation project at Arrowhead. The contest will also cap a rare NFL-MLB combination at the Truman Sports Complex as the Kansas City Royals face the Oakland A's at 2:10 PM. Kansas City is making its first appearance on MNF since 2005 and is hosting MNF for the first time since 2004.

Kansas City will open the season at home for the first time since 2006 and will host the Chargers on MNF for just the second time in this storied series between a pair of original American Football League franchises. An 86-yard punt return TD by the Chiefs in OT provided a thrilling conclusion to that initial MNF meeting at Arrowhead as KC secured a 29-23 OT victory (10/9/95).

Under the guidance of Head Coach Todd Haley, the Chiefs made substantial progress in 2009. The Chiefs improved in 30 different statistical categories and finished the year with a 44-24 victory at Denver (1/3/10). The Chiefs led the NFL in Red Zone scoring efficiency in 2009, scoring on 89.5 percent (34 of 38) of their Red Zone possessions. Kansas City also made dramatic gains over the course of the season's final eight games as the Chiefs averaged an NFL-best 5.2 yards per carry over the second half of the year. Defensively, the Chiefs ranked eighth in the NFL, forcing three and outs at a 24.4% (49 of 201) clip. Playing smarter has been a point of emphasis under Haley. The Chiefs ranked eighth in the NFL with just 84 penalties in 2009 and were sixth in penalty yardage (667) a year ago.

As of September 7th, 56.6% of the Chiefs roster (30 of 53 players) owned three years of experience or less, including 10 rookies. That rookie class features a seven-man 2010 draft class, six of whom were season captains for their final collegiate season. In total, the Chiefs added 16 new players to their roster in 2010. Based on ages as of September 1st, the average age of the Chiefs 53-man roster is 25.9 years old.

San Diego enters Monday's contest owning an 11-game regular season victory streak. The Chargers have won on their last three visits to Arrowhead, but haven't won four straight games in Kansas City since accomplishing the feat from '74-77. Up next for Kansas City is a road trip to Cleveland (9/19), while San Diego is home vs. Jacksonville (9/19).

THE SERIES

Kansas City holds a 50-49-1 (.505) all-time advantage over San Diego in regular and postseason play. All 50 of those victories against San Diego have come in regular season play. The only teams the Chiefs have defeated more frequently are Denver (53) and Oakland (51).

San Diego owns a five-game win streak in the series, its first five-game winning stretch against the Chiefs since '87-89. In 2009, the Chargers claimed a pair of victories over the Chiefs, a 37-7 decision at Arrowhead (10/25/09) and 43-14 victory at Qualcomm Stadium (11/29/09). Kansas City's most recent victory in the series was a 30-16 decision at San Diego (9/30/07). The Chiefs last victory over the Chargers at Arrowhead was a 30-27 win (10/22/06). KC's last sweep of the series came in 2003.

The home team has won 19 of the last 28 games in this series dating back to '96. Kansas City owns a 10-5 (.667) record against the Chargers at Arrowhead dating back to '95, including a string of seven straight victories from '97-03.

Chiefs-Chargers matchups are traditionally closely-contested battles. Excluding one tie between the two teams, a total of 12 games in this series have been decided by exactly one point, including two games in 2008. Those 12 one-point games are the most of any series in the league since '60.

The Chiefs and Chargers have met just one time in postseason play. San Diego claimed a win in the lone playoff tilt between the two clubs, registering a 17-0 victory in a '92 AFC Wild Card Playoff Game at San Diego (1/2/93).

CHIEFS VS. CHARGERS ON MONDAY NIGHT

Kansas City and San Diego have previously met twice in Monday Night Football telecasts with each team taking one victory in the series.

CHIEFS HEAD COACH - TODD HALEY



Todd Haley was named the 11th head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs on February 6, 2009 and begins his second year leading the Chiefs. Haley enters his 16th season in the NFL in 2010 and his 14th season as an NFL coach after beginning his career as a scouting assistant with the N.Y. Jets in '95.

Haley joined the Chiefs after a two-year stint as Arizona's offensive coordinator (2007-08), helping the Cardinals reach Super Bowl XLIII as the club won its first division title since

'75. Under Haley's direction, the Cardinals ranked third in the league in scoring as Arizona registered a franchise-record 427 points in 2008. The Cardinals also threw a team-record 32 TD passes in 2007.

Haley has won division titles with four different NFL teams. He served as passing game coordinator/WRs coach under Bill Parcells with Dallas (2004-06) after beginning his career under Parcells with the N.Y. Jets ('97-00). He also served as WRs coach with Chicago (2001-03). Born on February 28, 1967, Haley grew up in Upper St. Clair, PA. He is the son of longtime NFL personnel executive Dick Haley, who helped build the Steelers Super Bowl teams of the '70s. A '91 graduate of the University of North Florida he was a recipient of that school's 2009 Distinguished Alumni Award.

CHARGERS HEAD COACH - NORV TURNER



Norv Turner was named the 14th head coach in Chargers history on February 19, 2007 after spending the 2006 campaign as San Francisco's offensive coordinator. He guided San Diego to a third straight AFC West Division title and a 13-3 record in 2009 before being knocked out of the playoff hunt in the divisional round. Turner's 25 years of coaching experience include 12 as a head coach with three different franchises.

He led Oakland (2004-05) for two seasons and spent seven seasons as head coach of Washington ('94-00), guiding the Redskins to a 10-6 record and an NFC East title in '99.

The Lejeune, North Carolina native previously served as offensive coordinator in Miami (2002-03), San Diego (2001) and Dallas ('91-93) where he earned Super Bowl XXVII and XXVIII rings. Prior to joining Dallas, Turner coached six years with the L.A. Rams ('85-90), tutoring both the receivers and tight ends. He spent nine seasons at USC ('76-84) and was part of the Trojans '78 National Championship squad and four Rose Bowl teams. He entered the coaching profession as a graduate assistant with Oregon in '75. Turner earned three varsity letters as a QB at Oregon.

THE NEW ARROWHEAD: NEW BODY. SAME SOUL.

Thanks to the citizens of Jackson County, Missouri, who approved the measure that helped finance this \$375 million renovation of Arrowhead, Kansas City has a premier sports and entertainment venue. Chiefs Chairman Clark Hunt and his family have committed \$125 million to this project.

"Our vision for the New Arrowhead was 'new body, same soul,'" Hunt said. "We wanted to give our fans all of the amenities of a brand-new, first-class venue while preserving the iconic elements of the stadium. I am delighted to say that we exceeded my loftiest expectations, and we are extremely proud to show our fans the results."

- **10,850,299** linear feet of steel rebar were used on the project - a number equal to 36,168 football fields
- **115,096,950** wet pounds of concrete were utilized in the renovation equaling 57.5 tons or the weight of 10 Apache helicopters

2010 KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Kansas City enters the 2010 campaign under Head Coach Todd Haley. QB Matt Cassel begins his second year leading the Chiefs offense after being acquired via trade with New England in 2009. After finishing the 2009 season with 190 carries for 1,120 yards, RB Jamaal Charles is joined in the backfield by free agent RB Thomas Jones who rushed for 1,402 yards in 2009 with the N.Y. Jets. WR Chris Chambers totaled a team-high 608 receiving yards after being claimed off waivers from San Diego. He is joined by WRs Dwayne Bowe (D1-07) and Terrance Copper. TE Leonard Pope enters his fifth year in the league after joining the Chiefs in 2009. TE Jake O'Connell (D7-09) started a pair of contests in 2009 and is joined by rookie TE Tony Moeaki (D3b-10). Up front, four-time Pro Bowl G Brian Waters starts his 11th season in Kansas City. C Casey Wiegmann and G Ryan Lilja were both acquired in the off-season. They are joined by Ts Branden Albert (D1b-08), Ryan O'Callaghan and C Rudy Niswanger who was the only offensive player to start all 16 games in 2009.

Veteran LB Mike Vrabel pairs with LB Tamba Hali, who led the team in sacks with 8.5 last year. That duo returns to lead the linebacking corps along with Demorrio Williams, who led the team with 142 tackles in 2009. A pair of first-round draft pick DEs in Glenn Dorsey (D1a-08) and Tyson Jackson (D1-09) reside on the defensive line while DT Ron Edwards works in the middle. Ss Jon McGraw works with rookie Ss Eric Berry (D1-10) and Kendrick Lewis (D5a-10). CB Brandon Flowers (D2-08) led the team with five interceptions last year and pairs with CB Brandon Carr (D5-08).

K Ryan Succop (D7c-09) converted 86.21 percent of his FGs (25 of 29) in 2009, tying as the highest make percentage by a rookie since the AFL-NFL merger. P Dustin Colquitt owns the Chiefs career record with a 38.92-yard net punting average. WR Dexter McCluster (D2a-10) and CB Javier Arenas (D2b-10) are both big-play threats in the return game.

2010 SAN DIEGO CHARGERS

Under Head Coach Norv Turner the Chargers have won the last three AFC West titles. QB Philip Rivers returns from his second trip to the Pro Bowl in 2009 and second consecutive 4,000-yard passing season. The Chargers backfield will be void of the team's all-time leading rusher RB LaDainian Tomlinson (D1-01), but RB Darren Sproles (D4-05) returns after rushing for 343 yards in 2009. He is joined in the backfield by rookie RB Ryan Mathews (D1-10). TE Antonio Gates earned his sixth consecutive Pro Bowl selection with 1,157 receiving yards in 2009. WR Vincent Jackson (D2-05) led the team with 1,167 receiving yards on the way to his first Pro Bowl. WR Malcom Floyd was third on the team in 2009 with 776 receiving yards. T Marcus McNeil (D2-06) returns as a four-time Pro Bowl alternate selection. G Kris Dielman has been to three straight Pro Bowls and is joined in the trenches by Pro Bowl C Nick Hardwick (D3b-04).

The Chargers defense is led by three-time Pro Bowler LB Shawne Merriman (D1a-05). LB Shaun Phillips (D4-04) led the team with 7.0 sacks in 2009, while fellow LB Stephen Cooper led the team with 119 tackles. Returning DEs Jacques Cesaire and Luis Castillo (D1b-05) work on the defensive front. CB Quentin Jammer (D1-02) tied with CB Antonio Cromartie (D1-06) for the team lead with three interceptions. CB Antoine Cason (D1-08) works in the secondary with Jammer. They are joined by returning S Eric Weddle (D2-07) and S Steve Gregory. Rookie S Darrell Stuckey (D4-10) from the University of Kansas will look to get in the mix in 2010 after the departure of S Kevin Ellison (D6-09).

K Nate Kaeding's (D3a-04) career 87.2% make percentage makes him the NFL's all-time most accurate kicker. RB Darren Sproles has four career return TDs (two punt, two kick). P Mike Scifres (D5-03) enters his eighth season with the Chargers in 2010. LS David Binn begins his 17th season with the Chargers as the franchise's all-time leader in both seasons played (16) and games played (255).

Eight-time Kansas Broadcaster of the Year, Mitch Holthus, is in his 17th year handling the play-by-play duties, while Hall of Fame QB Len Dawson adds color commentary with sideline reports from former Chiefs Pro Bowl long snapper Kendall Gammon. The KCFX pregame show begins at 8:00 PM (CT). Following the game, the Chiefs FOX Football Radio Network, anchored by 101 the Fox (KCFX-FM), will air the first hour of the postgame show. The second hour will air on Sports Radio 810 (WHB-AM). Westwood One will broadcast the game to a national radio audience. Larry Kahn calls the action with color from former San Diego Pro Football Hall of Fame QB Dan Fouts. Laura Okmin will provide sideline reports. La Gran D 1340 AM out of Kansas City will broadcast the game locally in Spanish. Armando Quintero will call the play-by-play with Enrique Morales providing commentary. Josue Orante will report from the sidelines.

The Chiefs are seeking their initial win in a home opener since recording a 13-10 victory vs. Minnesota (9/23/07). KC and SD haven't squared off on Opening Day at Arrowhead since KC registered a 20-13 win (9/13/87). San Diego is 6-3 in its last nine Opening Day contests, including a 4-1 mark on the road. The Chiefs have won three straight September contests at Arrowhead vs. San Diego. The Chargers haven't won at Arrowhead in the season's opening month since recording a 24-23 victory (9/25/88). San Diego is 3-3 on the road in September dating back to 2006 with all three of those wins coming at Oakland.

OPENING DAY SUCCESS A POSTSEASON PRECURSOR

In the NFL's 44-year Super Bowl era, 81.8% of eventual NFL champions (36 of 44) won on Opening Day, including 15 of the last 20 Super Bowl Champions dating back to the '90 campaign. The Chiefs have made 15 playoff appearances and have won on Opening Day in 12 of those seasons. The only three times Kansas City has made the playoffs after failing to win on Opening Day were in '71, '97 and 2006.

In 2009, 10 of the 12 playoff teams were victorious on Kickoff Weekend. Arizona and Cincinnati were the only exceptions. Since '78 when the NFL went to the 16-game schedule, excluding the abbreviated '82 season, teams that are victorious on Kickoff Weekend are more than twice as likely to reach the playoffs than losers of an opening game. Of the 458 teams that won openers since '78, 243 (53.1%) went to the playoffs and 142 (31.0%) won division titles. Of the 458 teams that lost openers since '78, 102 (22.3%) went to the playoffs and 60 (13.1%) won division titles. In 2009, teams that qualified for the playoffs went 51-21 (.708) in division play.

WINNING STREAKS SNAPPED AT ARROWHEAD

Dating back to '95, the Chiefs have snapped 13 opponents' winning streaks of three games or more at Arrowhead. The longest opponent winning streak snapped by the Chiefs at Arrowhead was an 11-game San Francisco victory stretch in '97.

KC SEEKS TO SNAP SD'S WINNING STREAK

San Diego has won 11 consecutive regular season games dating back to the 2009 season, the NFL's longest active winning streak. The 11-game win streak is the longest streak since Indianapolis won 23 regular season games in a row from 2008-09. That victory string began with a 37-7 win at Kansas City (10/25/09). San Diego's last regular season loss came by a 24-23 count vs. Denver (10/19/09).

DIVISION/HOME/ROAD RECORDS

Six of Kansas City's last 10 victories have come against AFC West opponents. The Chiefs are seeking their first home victory against the Chargers since registering a 30-27 win (10/22/06). San Diego is 15-3 (.833) in division play dating back to 2007. The Chargers have won nine of their last 10 road games and were 7-1 on the road in 2009. The Chargers last road loss was a 38-28 setback at Pittsburgh (10/4/09).

CHIEFS-CHARGERS RUSHING STATS

Since the start of the 2003 campaign, Kansas City is 18-6 (.750) when it boasts a 100-yard back at Arrowhead. RB Jamaal Charles posted a pair of 100-yard rushing days at home in 2009 and produced a franchise-record 259 rushing yards in the 2009 regular season finale at Denver (1/3/10). The Chargers are just 3-6 (.333) when allowing a 100-yard back under Norv Turner.

The Chiefs averaged 142.6 rushing yards per game during the final eight contests of 2009 to rank sixth in the NFL. Kansas City continued that torrid rushing pace in the 2010 preseason, averaging 148.8 ypg, a figure that ranked second in the NFL, trailing only Pittsburgh (155.3 ypg). The Chiefs also registered a league-high 38 rushing first downs in the 2010 preseason and ranked third in the NFL, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.

The Chargers finished 31st in the NFL in rushing offense in 2009, averaging 88.9 ypg. Only Indianapolis (80.9 ypg) carried a lower rushing average. San Diego was one of three teams to not record an individual 100-yard rusher a year ago (Indianapolis and Philadelphia were the others). San Diego finished 20th in the NFL in rushing defense in 2009, allowing 117.6 ypg.

The Chiefs were one of five teams to post two TD runs of 50+ yards in 2009. KC was 17th in the NFL with 49 runs of 10+ yards, while SD finished tied for 31st with 32 runs of 10+ yards. San Diego is 37-1 (.968) when rushing 30 times or more dating back to 2005, including 28 consecutive victories.

MORE DATA ON THE CHIEFS GROUND GAME

For the first time in franchise history, the Chiefs boast a pair of running backs who enter a season coming off a 1,000-yard campaign in their previous NFL campaign. RB Thomas Jones ranked third in the NFL with a career-high 1,402 rushing yards for the N.Y. Jets in 2009. Dating back to 2005, only current Jets RB LaDainian Tomlinson (6,591) has more rushing yards than Jones (6,378). Jones and Rams RB Steven Jackson are the only two NFL backs to own a 1,000-yard campaign each of the past five seasons.

RB Jamaal Charles led the Chiefs in rushing yards (1,120), yards from scrimmage (1,417) and combined net yards (2,342) in 2009. He registered 968 rushing yards over the final eight games of the season, trailing only Tennessee RB Chris Johnson (1,047) during the final eight games of the 2009 campaign.

STARTING FAST IS ALWAYS IMPORTANT

From 2005-09, teams that qualified for the playoffs went 169-71 (.704) in the first four games of the season, including a 35-13 (.729) mark in 2009. Kansas City is seeking to post a winning record in the first quarter of the season since going 4-0 in 2003. San Diego is a combined 5-7 in the first quarter of the season over under Head Coach Norv Turner. In those 12 contests, San Diego has been outscored by a 26.3-to-25.6 margin. The Chargers have averaged 81.9 rushing ypg in those 12 contests, while allowing 116.3 rushing ypg. The Chargers haven't posted a winning record in the first quarter of the season since going 3-1 to open the 2006 campaign.

CHIEFS-CHARGERS SCORING STATS

The Chiefs are 13-2 (.867) all-time vs. San Diego at Arrowhead when holding the Chargers to 17 points or less, including a streak of six straight wins. Dating back to 2000, San Diego is 4-41 (.089) when being held to 17 points or less. The Chargers are 1-8 (.111) in those circumstances under Head Coach Norv Turner, including a streak of eight straight losses. Dating back to 2000, the Chargers are 2-26 (.071) on the road when being held to 17 points or less, including a string of 10 straight losses. San Diego's last road win in such a circumstance was a 17-6 victory at Carolina (10/24/04).

Dating back to 2007, the Chargers are 16-2 (.889) when scoring 30 points or more, including nine straight wins. The Chargers have outscored their opponents by an average margin of 30.0 to 16.7 during their 11-game winning streak. The Chargers have hit the 30-point mark just twice in their last 23 visits to KC.

THREE AND OUTS FORCED

The Chiefs ranked eighth in the league in 2009, forcing three-and-outs on 24.4% of opponents' drives (49 of 201). The N.Y. Jets led the league in that department at 34.2%. SD's offense ranked second in the NFL in 2009, going three and out on just 16.5% (28 of 170) of its drives, while the Chargers defense was 12th in the NFL, forcing three and outs at a 23.8% (40 of 168) clip.

QB MATT CASSEL'S PASSING STATS

No NFL passer threw more fourth-quarter TDs than QB Matt Cassel (10) in 2009. Cassel averaged 6.86 yards per attempt and compiled an 80.4 rating in the fourth quarter in 2009. By comparison, Chargers QB Philip Rivers threw only five fourth-quarter TDs in 2009. Cassel's squads are 5-1 when he boasts a game with a 100.0 rating or better and own a 2-2 mark when he produces 300 yards.

MORE CHIEFS-CHARGERS SCORING STATS

The Chiefs and Chargers were two of the NFL's most prolific scoring teams in the fourth quarter a year ago. San Diego ranked fourth in the league with 124 fourth-quarter points, while Kansas City (118) was fifth in that department. Exactly 40.1% (118 of 294) of KC's points came in the fourth quarter in 2009, while 27.3% (124 of 454) of SD's total points were scored in the final frame. Defensively, only six teams permitted more fourth-quarter points than Kansas City (115) and San Diego (114).

San Diego ranked third in the league in second-half scoring with 231 points, while the Chiefs tied for 10th in that department with 179 second-half points. The Chargers allowed 171 points in the second half, while KC permitted 215.

KC SET TO SQUARE OFF AGAINST QB PHILIP RIVERS

San Diego QB Philip Rivers owns a 14-2 record as a starter vs. the rest of the AFC West, but is 6-2 vs. KC. Rivers has suffered at least one INT in six of his eight starts against the Chiefs and has been picked off twice in three of those games. Rivers has suffered nine INTs in eight starts against KC and has been picked off nine times in his 16 starts against other AFC West foes. Dating back to '95, KC is 8-2 at Arrowhead vs. SD when forcing at least one INT. The Chiefs are 34-5 (.872) at home over that same span when forcing two or more INTs. KC has won 10 straight at Arrowhead against SD when registering two or more INTs.

THE CHIEFS NEED TWO SOLID HALVES VS. SD

Teams leading at the half have won 17 of the last 23 games in the Chiefs-Chargers series dating back to '97. SD is 48-8 (.857) when leading at halftime dating back to 2004, including wins in 23 of their last 25 such contests. The Chargers are just 5-9 (.357) when tied or trailing at the half dating back to 2008. In the last 13 meetings at Arrowhead, Kansas City owns a 200-to-83 first-half scoring advantage over the Chargers. San Diego outscored its opponents by a 74-point margin in the first half in 2009 (223 scored/149 allowed).

Prior to last season, San Diego hadn't held a halftime lead at Arrowhead since '96. The Chargers have won four straight games vs. the Chiefs and have outscored KC by a combined 44-point margin (64-20) in the second half of those games. The last time KC outscored SD in the second half was a 30-16 victory at San Diego (9/30/07) when the Chiefs held a 24-0 scoring edge after halftime.

CLOSE CALLS COMMON FOR CHIEFS, CHARGERS

Dating back to 2000, the Chargers hold a slim 11-9 series lead vs. KC. Over that span, 11 of those 20 contests have been decided by seven points or less with the Chargers holding a 6-5 edge in those 11 close games. Eight of Kansas City's games in 2009 were decided by seven points or less with the Chiefs going 2-6 (.250) in those contests. The Chargers were 6-1 (.857) in contests decided by seven points or less in 2009, including a streak of five straight victories. Exactly 42.9% (110 of 256) of games in the NFL last season were determined by seven points or less.

CHIEFS-CHARGERS TURNOVER STATS

The Chiefs were +4 (10 takes/6 gives) in their four victories in 2009. San Diego posted a +8 turnover margin (25 takes/17 gives) a year ago to rank sixth in the NFL. The Chargers were 10th in the NFL by scoring 100 points off its takeaways, but only allowed only 44 points on giveaways to tie for the second-lowest total in the NFL. Kansas City scored 77 points on takeaways and allowed 85 points off giveaways in 2009. The Chiefs are 47-9 (.839) at Arrowhead with a positive turnover margin dating back to '95. A total of 11 of the league's 12 postseason qualifiers in 2009 finished the year with a positive turnover differential. The only exception was Arizona, who went -7 (29 takes/36 gives). Teams that went +1 or better turnover differential in games recorded a 164-47 (.777) record, while clubs going +2 or better produced a combined 100-16 (.862) record in 2009.
